Note: There were no swimming lessons in 2019-2020; sessions in the summer term were cancelled due to Covid. In Summer 2022, 50% of Y6 pupils were able to swim 25 metres or more.

Swimming lessons are provided in Y3 and Y4. Re 2020-2021 77% of Y3 and Y4 pupils were able to swim over 5 metres with 36% able to swim 25 metres or more.

Activity	Cost	Evaluation of Impact
Development of pupils' self-confidence and self-esteem through extra activities including transport costs.	£600	Participation in events is encouraged and celebrated to support pupil self-esteem and confidence. In particular, KS2 pupils benefitted from taking part in local tournaments and the Salisbury Mini-Marathon. Y5 and Y6 pupils benefitted from active team building activities at Hooke Court on a residential visit in September 2021.
Effective delivery of the PE Curriculum to support and encourage a healthy lifestyle.	£14,500	All pupils take part in PE sessions based on the National Curriculum. Pupils from R-Y4 also benefitted from weekly gymnastic and dance sessions with delivery supported by specialists.
After school activities	£1000	25% of pupils enjoyed taking part in sports activities after school. This was limited during periods of restriction due to Covid.
Equipment provision and safety checks	£500	Active playtimes have been encouraged. Pupils have access to the sport's field during the drier/summer months and climbing area. Sports' Coach engaged to promote fair play on Monday mornings at playtimes and at the school breakfast club.
