Our enquiry this term is 'What did Brunel do for Great Britain?' and we will be thinking like historians, engineers and scientists to answer this question.

In mathematics the children will be learning to tell the time using digital and analogue clocks. Some children find this quite tricky so any help you can give them at home, such as telling the times at o'clock and half past, learning to order the days of the week and the months of the year, and talking about what they are doing today, what they did yesterday and what they will do tomorrow would be great.

We are continuing to develop our continuous provision areas and are pleased to see the children accessing the activities independently.

Bonnie, the reading dog, visits once a week and the children enjoy reading to her.

We have been invited to visit Coombe Bissett Farm to see the lambs and calves. This fits in well with our work on seasons and animals.
